COMBINE ACADEMY'S SECRET WEAPONS

Meet Coach Ben Betts and Coach Bob Reasso, both directors of their respective sports at Combine Academy with impressive collegiate career experience. Combine is blessed to have their knowledge and expertise readily available to not only their coaching staffs but also our student-athletes. During our January 24th Friday Seminar, Reasso and Betts presented to the student body, sharing their knowledge of the college athlete, the recruiting process, and words of wisdom when it comes to this particular time in our student athletes' lives. Whether it is the mental perseverance that is so pivotal to uphold during these years or the need for routine and structure, Coach Reasso and Coach Betts highlighted several key qualities and mindsets needed to be asuccessful 21st century collegiate athlete. As a student body, we thank both of these gentlemen for their time and dedication during our Friday Seminar.

Coach Reasso spent the majority of his 30+ year Hall of Fame career as the head coach at NCAA Division I Rutgers University. Then, in 2013, he was appointed as Head Coach at Pfeiffer University, located in Misenheimer, North Carolina. Over the course of his career, Reasso was a two-time National Coach of the Year, led teams to 16 NCAA tournament appearances, 4 final four appearances, 2 national championship appearances, and compiled a record of 436-209-79. During his coaching career, Reasso coached 60 players that have gone on to play professionally, with 24 of those players playing in the MLS, and 24 NCAA All-Americans.

Coach Betts has coached at the D1 level for over 30 years. From his D1 head coaching position at SC State from 2003-2006 to numerous assistant coaching positions across the country: Oklahoma, VCU, College of Charleston, Tennessee State, and Georgia Southern to name just a few, Coach Betts has had 5 NCAA tournament appearances and has coached notable players, like Blake Griffin, Robert Covington, and John Konchar. Coach Betts played four years at Roanoke College, and he originally grew up in Madison Heights, VA.

Rose Ellis is teaching Creative Writing this Spring. Painting with words, as she calls it, is one of her greatest gifts and favorite hobbies. Her largest creative project has been developing, contributing to, and editing a community magazine for a non-profit organization in Pennsylvania. She is up to date on practices related to basic research, formatting, and composition at the collegiate level. Her undergraduate degree is in psychology, which greatly refined her skill set. Currently, she is working on an M.Ed. in teaching and is on track to graduate this spring with distinction. She has taught elementary through high school for about ten years in various settings and subjects and is also licensed to practice educational therapy.
